Consul General of Guatemala, Claudia Gatica had the opportunity to open the Consulate General in Seattle in August 2017.

Prior to that time, she held different positions at the Consulate General of Guatemala in New York and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, which included a variety of activities and courses that enhanced her knowledge and background in diplomacy over many years.

She studied Business Administration at the San Carlos University in Guatemala and she enjoys

watching and playing basketball.

Working for the Government of Guatemala has allowed Claudia to establish a connection with many state agencies, state personnel, non-profit organizations and with the Guatemalan community as a whole. By assisting with the administrative process, aiding the people of Guatemala, and opening new offices in Seattle, Washington, and Omaha, Nebraska, she has learned many things.

She attended a seminar held in the Republic of South Korea by KOICA (Korean International Cooperation Agency) with the intention of aiding the Guatemalan immigration process to countries in Latin America. She also had the opportunity to be the coordinator of a temporary Consulate in Trenton, New Jersey, which helped introduce the distributing of IDs to the Guatemalan community in 2016. Approximately 4,000 individuals were processed and helped during this time.

As part of the functions Claudia preforms, she promotes the culture of Guatemala in all aspects, as well as publicizing the natural wealth of the country.


