TODAY'S PROGRAM

Today's program was introduced by WANDA QUINN. In the spirit of Aloha, CLINT SCHROEDER was welcomed into our club s sohana (family) in 2019 when he relocated from Honolulu, Hawaii to take on the role of Regional Publisher of the Hagadone Communications Division.

Clint grew up in Wyoming and joined his first Rotary Club in Colorado 21 years ago today! He has served in a variety of roles and recalls how his view of Rotary changed from being ojust a Rotary member to a Rotarian. He had a quote listed on his slideshow presentation that summed up his view of being a Rotarian. Service is the rent we pay to be living. It is the very purpose of life and not something you do in your spare time.

Clint loves how Rotary is an avenue that allows people to not only do good in their community, but also connect with a variety of international service opportunities. Clint has been President of the large metro Honolulu club and also Assistant District Governor and District Governor of Hawaii, District 5000 from 2016-2017. In his Presidential year, the International Peace Conference was held in Honolulu and he was honored to be able to participate. He also attended the international conference in Bangkok, Thailand with 35,000 other Rotarians from around the world.

Clint has visited 19 countries for Rotary service work and has gone to India to help immunize over 50 million children with the Polio vaccine. He has also visited and participated in projects in Myanmar the year he was District Governor. He spoke of how a modest \$3,800 was raised while in the country from a few Rotarians on site to help build new, much needed sanitary bathrooms on higher ground for students housed in a modest monastery/school dwelling. A similar project that sticks with him is seeing first-hand how \$5,500 helped to build a vocational school in New Delhi,

Clint talked of the rising Rotary leaders coming not from the United States, but from Southeast Asia and Europe. Clint is a pleasure to speak with and listen to. He has a multitude of stories of how incredible experiences have brought Rotary to life for him. The people we meet in Rotary become our family and friends. Clint is always up for talking Rotary and willing to help partner on projects and share resources and contacts he has made over his Rotary service years.
