Presidentâ€™s Corner

Hello!

This Saturday we celebrate the 40th anniversary of our Rotary Club Charter. It was 1982 when a four-member committee, led by Ron Hart, was appointed to form a new Rotary Club.

There were two Rotary clubs in Clark County at that point: Rotary Club of Vancouver (founded 1921) and Rotary Club of Clark County (founded 1974). Our club, then called Rotary Club of East Vancouver, received its official charter on January 19, 1984, with 24 charter members. The first meetings were held at Kopper Kitchen in Orchards, Friday mornings at 7 a.m. Membership peaked in 1994 at around 90 members.

Our clubâ€™s signature service project early on was the Clark County Hall of Fame Awards and Banquet and the installation of a Rose Garden at Orchards Park to honor the recipients. We also helped to clean up Orchards Park and built the picnic shelter. We continue to maintain the Rose Garden today and the picnic shelter is in frequent use.

In those early years, scholarships were awarded, Interact clubs were sponsored, many exchange students were hosted, fundraisers came and went and many of the service projects that we still do today were started.

Fast-forward to today, and we have a different name and a much smaller membership, but we continue to have the heart and drive of a 90-plus member club. This year we have completed almost 20 service projects and held 10 social gatherings to make sure we are having fun. Our foundation has awarded more than \$68,000 in scholarships, community, and international grants this Rotary year so far. I think that is a reason to celebrate!

Congratulations to all past and current members of the Rotary Club of East Vancouver and The Rotary Club of Vancouver Sunrise for 40 years of service.

We will celebrate by doing what we do best, providing service to this community. Our Meal Packaging Event on Saturday will provide 10,000 meals to people in our community who deal with food insecurity.
