Winners of The Four Way Test Competition

Kate Eames: Life has dilemmas and integrating the four-way test into everyday life can keep your moral compass straight. A good way to incorporate it into your life is to use it on simple situations and begin to use it often. Then, you will be ready for complicated situations.

Sichen Fan: Produced a video illustrating an example of using the four-way test as a guide for making a fishing decision. A good metaphor for daily lives.

Jasmine Liu: Presented an example of the four-way test not being used. She then described the repercussions that resulted in not living the ethical life the four-way test guides.

Kate Birdsall: Kate reminds us that it is a choice to think about the results of your actions and the four-way test helps us navigate challenging situations. It can be used to think before you act in both simple and complex situations. She provided an example from her own experiences with online classes, and the responsibility a student has, to learn for themselves and not waste the teacher's or other students' time. The whole class benefits from a participation that the four-way test will guide.

Justin Zuo: Guidelines for proper behavior in Zoom Schooling can be derived from the four-way test. Justin gave us an example of a child taking advantage of online classes and not doing what they are supposed to. Justin explains how the behavior effects not only him, but the other students, teacher and parents. He also contrasted this with a student that follows the 4-way test to act appropriately and benefits all.

Drishti Singh: She wrote about a speech Paul Harris gives to her class explaining the four-way test. She then illustrated a four-way test to pick up trash on the street and how it can better the community.
