A Special Guest Speaker **Lisa Broderick** Executive Director, Police2Peace

Police2Peace® is a research-driven organization that creates demonstrably positive changes in the way communities and departments engage with one another. With police reform top of mind for so many communities, they see a key aspect of reform as better connecting the police with society to heal and uplift communities. One way they do this is by offering departments and communities the opportunity to self-review and then follow-up with programs to create greater community engagement.

They work to establish a community feedback loop with 7 steps to police reform that include input from the mayor, City Council and the Community.

- Task force
- Review police line item budget
- Review Police contracts
- Work with city Council to make sure they know union contract
- Together with community groups define challenges
- Make list of recommendations
- Get sign-off from community

Police2Peace currently works with police departments all over the country to define helpful changes in police departments and police unions that result in better relationships with their communities.

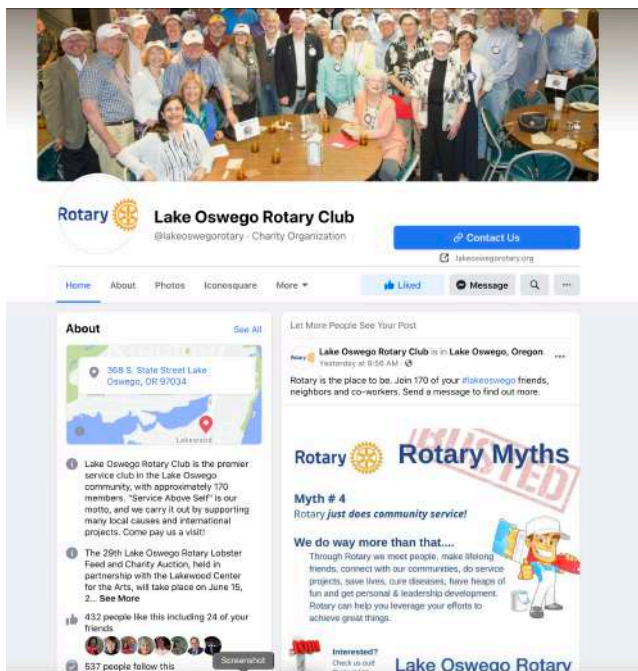
