Dan says, he enjoys Rotary where everyone is sharing a calling of empathy and act of kindness.





# Featured Speaker Mitch Magenheimer

Mitch, current president (3<sup>rd</sup> time) of the Rotary Club of Molalla, spoke to the incredible community effort in fighting the fires that burned the edges of the town of Molalla, and inflicted painful losses for some residents.

Residents lost homes, barns, animal feed, and other valuables that may or may not be covered by insurance. The club of Molalla, as well as the community church, are doing what's possible to respond to the immediate needs, and needs that cannot wait for other relief.

The community used whatever resources they could gather to fight the fires and prevent them from consuming animals, and valuables. They helped elderly residents, sheltered animals, and responded with water and other necessities.
