## Speakers Recap

Our first three speakers this Rotary year talked to us about international relations, peace and conflict resolution, efforts to restore constructive and civil dialogue among people of different backgrounds and beliefs, and about the work of a regional US Senator's office.

Fellow Rotarian and author Dan Sockle offered his insights on the ongoing conflict between the West and Radical Islam (Islamism) and his perspective on what the West must do to prevent and resolve such conflicts by bringing focus to shared values and common interests and developing greater widespread awareness of world religions and cultures among the Western society at large. Dan is involved with [Better Angels](#), an organization bringing Americans of divergent political perspectives together to understand each other beyond stereotypes, form community alliances, relate to one another as citizens. Through workshops, debates, and campus engagement activities Better Angels works to reduce the toxicity dividing our civic culture.

Former VMS Rotarian Dena Horton provided us an inside view of what it's like to work for a US Senator and what Senator Maria Cantwell's Vancouver regional office does.

Most recently, Jackie Spurlock shared with us her experiences from her time living in and visiting Iran and explained what her organization, [CODEPINK](#), does to improve US-Iranian relations. CODEPINK is a women-led grassroots organization working to end U.S. militarism, supporting peace and human rights initiatives, and redirect tax dollars to areas like healthcare and education.
