### **Update on Homeless Teen Shelter Project:**

In May, our club and Charitable Trust committed \$24,000 to an overnight teen shelter at United Methodist Church. This multiple club effort was intended to meet the needs of unhoused young people during the pandemic. Shortly after we made the donation, St. Vincent de Paul, which providing staffing for the 15th Night shelter, decided to close all its emergency COVID-19 shelters. Fifteenth Night reformulated its efforts as a day shelter with a different nonprofit providing staffing. While other area Rotary clubs decided to transfer their donations from SVDP to the new nonprofit, our Club's Rotary Board decided it would rather look for another project to support young homeless teens and our donation has been returned. We know that many people in our club are interested in supporting youth, and in particular the needs of unhoused teens. We are hopeful that our Club will identify another project that addresses this needs in the next year.
