# THAT IS RIGHT NOW!

Altman, the 19th head coach in the history of the University of Oregon men s. basketball program, has led the Ducks to 10 consecutive 20-win seasons and 10 postseason appearances. He led Oregon to five straight NCAA Tournaments (2013-17) for the first time in school history, winning at least one game in each of those years. Included in those NCAA appearances are a Final Four (2017), two Elite Eights (2016, 2017) and three Sweet 16s (2013, 2016, 2017). The Ducks made their fourth Sweet 16 appearance under Altman in 2019 and were named the Pac-12 s automatic qualifier for Liz Cawood the 2020 NCAA Tournament before the worldwide Coronavirus epidemic canceled the postseason. Altman now has 22 seasons of 20-plus wins to his credit (11 at Creighton, 10 at Oregon, one at Kansas State).
