I am very pleased that we plan on Inducting another new member on Tuesday (see this week's video) and I would ask that when that happens you listen carefully to the Past President who officially inducts the member. At the induction we will learn a little about the inductee from their sponsor, but then the Past President gives their version of what it means to be a Rotarian. Liz Cawood recently gave an excellent induction talk. I learned something about Liz and Rotary. In fact the Dali Lama says " when you talk, you are only repeating something you already know. You can only learn something new by listening to others."

In todays world we too often are caught up in our own version of the world and what that version's truth is. We often only listen to experts who agree with our version of the truth. If Covid hasn't taught us anything else, it should have taught us there are a lot of experts out there, they don't all agree, and their truth may change over time. In my time working in the Coast Guard and in the Maritime industry I have spent a lot of time trying to solve problems, minimize the effects of oil and chemical spills, and make things safer on the water worldwide. Sometimes you have plans to follow or have trained for a situation, but often times not. But one truth I learned during all of this was to listen to my people, especially those on scene, and that often good solutions came from the least expected places. If you listen!!

In New York we had to move a grounded tanker to deeper water in a bay on Long Island Sound to offload its oil. I asked a room full of "expert" operators where we should take it, with no answer. I heard the low voice of a Maritime cadet, who had just started drilling with us as a reservist "take it here" he pointed to a spot on the chart that no depths marked. "Who are you and how do you know this," I asked. "I'm Cadet Dennis Miller and I fish there all the time with my Dad", he proudly answered. I sent Cadet Miller went off with the group of "experts" to determine where to anchor the lightering vessel and they **listened** to him. The operation proceeded flawlessly. Two years later I was privileged to Commission Ensign Miller in the Coast Guard at his graduation from New York Maritime University at Fort Schuyler, NY. Yesterday I wished Commander Retired Dennis Miller a happy birthday on FB and he replied, I was fishing!

Good Rotarians should be good listeners, even to those whose views they may not agree with. The 4-way test certainly pushes us in that direction, as does the Dali Lama. Tuesday we will be listening to the Stove Team International and their efforts to bring safe cooking to the world. It should be a interesting program we can all learn from. I hope you will attend and bring a friend.
