

Jim McGavin will discuss sustainably producing wine grapes in Oregon's Willamette Valley from site selection through to the harvesting of our world renowned pinot noir grapes.

Jim and his wife Wendy have owned Walnut Ridge Vineyard since 2000. Walnut Ridge has been certified sustainable by the internationally sanctioned Low Input Viticulture and Enology (LIVE) which certifies vineyards in Oregon, Washington and Idaho. Jim and Wendy were the recipient of the Excellence in Sustainability Award in 2016. Jim is the president of the Prairie Mountain Wineries Association, past president of the South Willamette Wineries Association, and a past Member of the Oregon Wine Board Nominating Committee.
