As the state's Wildfire Recovery Ombudsman, Michael's primary responsibility is working with state and local agencies to identify and resolve issues in the built environment--planning, zoning, wetlands, floodplain, and building codes among others. Although assigned to the Office of Emergency Management, he reports directly to Matt Garrett, Director for Wildfire Recovery in Governor Brown's office.


