August 3rd Meeting • Legislative Session Update

State Representative Marty Wilde highlights recent Legislative Session.

August 3 program, State Representative Marty Wilde will share highlights from the recently-adjourned Legislative Session. The multiple crises of the past year COVID, wildfires, ice storms amplified existing economic instability for many Oregonians. The 2021 Legislative Session was focused on providing support for frontline workers, small businesses, rural communities, and other impacted communities. As our community, our state, and our nation begin to recover and build back better, Representative Wilders top priority is to ensure no one gets left behind.

State Representative Marty Wilde grew up in rural Oregon on an organic farm. The cooperation to support families in the community he saw there gave rise to his belief that public service and collaboration are essential to make sure no one is left behind. After graduating from University of Maryland, Marty joined the military to pay forward the help he had received from so many in his youth. Through his 27 years of military service Rep. Wilde has fought forest fires in Oregon, worked on converting a coal plant in Alaska, prosecuted cases of sexual assault in Qatar, hunted down war criminals in Bosnia, and served as Chief, Rule of Law in Afghanistan, where he earned a Bronze Star.

First elected in 2018, Representative Wilde is currently in his second two-year term as State Representative. He Chairs the House Committee on General Government and serves on the Judiciary Committee, Water Committee, Equitable Policing Committee, and the Joint Committee on Ways and Means General Government Subcommittee.



To help with this, Lane County Waste Management has developed a program of neighborhood based Community Plastics Collectors. Each volunteer collector works to facilitate plastics recycling in their neighborhoods. Your Environmental Committee encourages all Rotarians to take advantage of this program if your neighborhood has a Community Collector. Uganda Service Trip in January!

We are announcing the opportunity for club members to participate in teams that will be going to Uganda in January. As you know, our club has been working on an important international project to establish maternal and child health services in rural communities that have no medical resources. We have also undertaken a major project to repair broken well pumps and pipes restoring water to 32 communities serving thousands of people. The teams will give opportunities to see firsthand the impact of these and other Rotary projects. One of the two teams will include medical doctors, nurses, and support staff to provide medical

assistance to communities served by the Rural Health Team, our partners in the Maternal & Child Health project.

The group is coordinated by Larry Rhodes from the Rotary Club of Eugene Airport (larryrhodes@gmail.com), who has been taking groups to Uganda for the past 14 years. Please let (Dennis?
