## **President's Message September 15th**

With everything that is going on and continued smokey skies outside, it is really hard to be positive, but then we receive messages of concern and action by our District Governor Cindi O'Neil. First she put out a need for Red Cross volunteers and told everyone how they can volunteer by helping either on-scene or at home. We have a few from our club who wanted to help and I would ask that if you have signed up to be a volunteer, or are already a Red Cross volunteer, please let me know too, as they would like all Presidents to keep track of club volunteers. Also she has sent out a Letter telling us about the Rotary District 5110 Fire Relief Strategy to help rebuild after the fires to be led by Past District Governor, and our club member Rick Olson. He will run a District wide task force developing a template for future natural disasters similar to what was done for the Paradise fire two years ago in California. This will focus on helping people and businesses after Red Cross leaves, and for needs that FEMA does not address. He will work with AG Pete Gribskov to develop a model for disbursements, using information from the Paradise Rotary club foundation on how they did it in 2018.

We will have another great program this week from Huerto de la Familia (the family garden) telling us about how this organization is helping in our community. Also District secretary Beth Sheehan will tell us how we can participate in our District Fund Raiser "Rotary Steps Together," which will now include a way to raise money for fire relief. Both of these efforts are highlighted in the bulletin.

I hope to see you all at this weeks meeting. Remember to join early for our 1200-1215 social time and to invite a freind.



## **ROTARY - District 5110 Fire Relief Strategy**

I am deeply saddened by the loss of homes and lives in the recent wildfire conflagrations across our District, our State and our Rotary friends to the south in California. I have conferred with our District 5110 Assistant Governors and you will be relieved to know that to their knowledge there have not been any current Rotary families that have lost homes or lives this past week. We have been lucky, and we are grateful for our good fortune. We also recognize the tremendous desire of our Rotarians to help in some fashion, to support our communities. As the District we are committed to help and support you in that endeavor.

The District Leadership met to discuss the current situation regarding the fires today, Friday, Sept 11, a coincidental special day of remembrance for all of us.

We feel strongly that Rotary is well suited to help collaborate in the development & coordination of a long-term rebuilding strategy for our District. In the near term, with other prominent and trained organizations handling immediate disaster relief, we have decided that raising funds for future distribution via disaster grants that help rebuild the fire devastated areas of our District would be the best use of our strengths and funds. To that end we have set up a district repository for contributions for a future fire relief effort. The Rotary Club of Eugene Charitable Trust, a 501c3, can accept tax deductible contributions for fire relief (see address below). The Eugene Club will set aside these Fire Relief Funds until we have a sound grant program in place to help rebuild communities in need. I have asked Immediate Past District Governor, Rick Olson, to develop a list of Rotary members, community leaders, NGO's and corporate partners to participate in a District-wide Fire Rehabilitation Task Force. These efforts can be the template for future natural disasters that we may face in the future.

Since we are set to begin the District-wide "Rotary Steps Together" fundraiser on Sept 15, next Tuesday, we are adding a Fire Relief Fund option to the fundraiser. Rotarians will be able to choose that fund option to request pledges of support from the public, friends and family during the 8-week fundraiser. We know the smoke may inhibit outdoor exercise and so we may extend the fundraising period to ten weeks if need be. The funds will be added to the Rotary Club of Eugene Charitable Trust at the end of the 8-week period. Remember this is your opportunity to garner charitable donations outside of your Rotary Club.

Immediate Disaster Relief Volunteer Opportunities: The Red Cross has reached out to me with a need for qualified volunteers who are willing to go through online training & vetting through a background check, and final onsite "stand-up" training to help with shelter logistics. They also need trained and vetted volunteers to do virtual volunteerism online to logistically support food deliveries, supply deliveries, etc. Go to your local Red Cross websites to register as a volunteer and go through the training. After you have completed your training, send your name and contact information directly to your Assistant Governor and they will forward your name to our SW Regional Red Cross Director, Carisa Hettich, also a Rotarian from the Rotary Club of Eugene Delta.

**Stay in contact with your Rotary members in these times.** Make sure everyone is safe, doing OK and has what they need to remain so. Every Club should develop a phone tree right now. The smoke pollution is a serious health threat for vulnerable individuals and many could use the outreach and connection just to reduce their stress.

Stay in tune with developments related to Rotary, the fire situation, and evacuation announcements. Also, communicate to your Assistant Governor any urgent news, immediate needs for help, or offers of assistance. I encourage everyone to sign up for County-specific emergency alerts. Next week's D5110 eNews will be about ways to help, ways to raise funds, and other volunteer opportunities. Rotarians are at their best when there is need. We are "People of Action." Thank you all for your creativity, charitable hearts, and actions through service.
