On Thursday and Friday I lost 2 classmates within 24 hours, both to long battles, one with cancer and one to head trauma/Alzheimer's, both battled for most of 2020. Because of Covid, part of that battle was without their family being there, which was equally tragic. One of them lateraled from the CG to the Air Force and became an AF Jet pilot. The other retired as a Commander in the CG after 20 years, as a CG Lawyer (he was also the President of the Plymouth, MI Rotary club just a few years ago). Our class at CGA graduated just over 200, so you knew everyone. To this day about 120 of us are still on a group email and swap sea stories daily! A pretty amazing bond when you think about it! One that shares sorrow and gives strength from wherever we are located! So as we share in the Joy and celebration of Christmas, let's take a moment to think about those we know who are suffering at this time and give them our strength and joy.

When I think of memorial services one in particular stands out to me, when I was a pall bearer for a fellow Coastie at Arlington Cemetery (I did that about 6 times while stationed at CG Headquarters in DC). It was for a senior Officer that I had served under and a lone bagpiper played, "Amazing Grace." It was beautiful and yet haunting and most appropriate. Now I happen to love the bag pipe music (must be that Scottish heritage). On my trips to Scotland (and Ireland), I have sought out bag pipe music and Jan has always humored me. One such concert was a gathering of the clans at Edinburgh Castle for Queen Elizabeth's Silver Jubilee (in 1977) at sunset. It was spectacular and one of the songs the Clan bag pipes played in unison was Amazing Grace. So Ravi has attached a version for you. It is just beautiful! Enjoy and be uplifted.

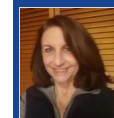

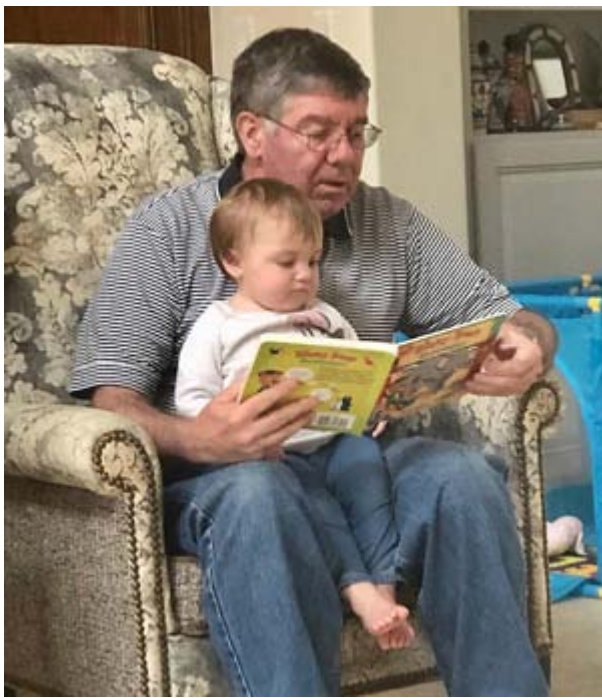

Date put off due to State Covid Restrictions. Stay tuned for an announcement of the all clear to schedule again.



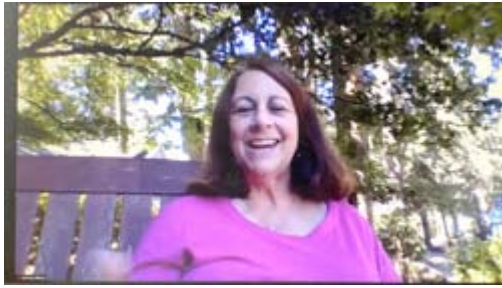
Monica's Volunteer Corner

The Rotary Club of Eugene is raising \$20,000 to repair (not replace) up to 20 existing wells in 4 rural sub-counties of the Tororo District of Uganda as a separate but complimentary project to the club's global grant.
