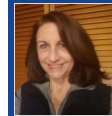

Covid Report from Liz Ness

It's important to differentiate between additional doses and booster doses of the Covid-19 vaccine. Additional doses are recommended for anyone immunocompromised to ensure there is sufficient immune response. Booster doses are given to those who experienced initial sufficient immune response that may have waned over time.

If you or someone you know is immunocompromised and might qualify for an additional dose of Pfizer or Moderna they should check with their physician who will instruct them. These doses may be received at any pharmacy or clinic that currently administers the vaccine. These locations may require a doctor's order. This additional dose is administered a minimum of 28 days after the second dose.

We're still waiting for clarity on booster doses but at this time we're assuming those will start within the next month or so. More information to follow.

Ravitej attended the clinic at Lane Event Center to receive an additional dose and was pleasantly greeted by a volunteer Rotarian and a non-member Rotary

volunteer. The work we do at these clinics is invaluable and greatly appreciated.

We also need to stress the importance of mask wearing. The charts you see here clearly show positive the impact of masks on the spread of Covid. Keep up the good work and stay safe and healthy!
