# **April 23 Program - 4J Local Option Election**



The Eugene School District local option levy is a property tax that provides money for 4J school operations, such as teachers, programs, utilities and other daily operating costs. The levy currently provides about \$17 million per year, equivalent to about 161 teaching positions or 26 school days. All levy proceeds stay in the Eugene School District and fund 4J public school operations.

The 4J local option levy has been approved by voters four times, beginning in 2000. The current levy will expire in 2020 if it is not renewed by voters. The Eugene School Board has voted to refer a five-year renewal of the local option levy to the May 2019 election ballot.

If voters approve the levy renewal on May 21, it would continue the local option levy at the same tax rate for another five years, through June 2025. Renewal of the levy would provide funds to maintain school days, school programs, class sizes and other school service levels.

Without this levy, the school district would need to reduce general fund operating costs and services by about 9 percent beginning with the 2020 21 school year.

Under Oregon law, a local option levy is the only way voters in a school district can provide local property tax funding for teachers, class sizes, school programs and other school operation costs. By contrast, capital bond funds, such as the bond measure approved by 4J voters in 2018, can only be spent on buildings, buses, books and other capital investments.

Voters who live in Eugene School District 4J and are registered to vote by April 30 will be eligible to vote on the levy renewal measure.

# **April 30 Program - County Courthouse Bond Measure**

Join us to learn more about a bond on the May ballot which will help fund a new county courthouse.

The proposed courthouse would be built on the former Eugene City Hall lot and accommodate 18 state-run courtrooms, up from the current 15, as well as the district attorney so office, parole and probation, victim services and sheriff so office. At 297,000 square feet, the proposed building would be more than double the size of the current county courthouse at Seventh Avenue and Oak Street in downtown Eugene.



The estimated cost of the project is \$252 million. The county is in line to receive \$87.6 million in state funding for the project, pending legislative approval. The county already has received \$6.4 million in state funding for planning work.

All funds raised will be going to the Rural Health Team, a nonprofit organization made up of an international team of doctors and nurses committed to serving village communities in Uganda, including both medical services and resources along with health education. Over the last 10 years, these teams have served over 22,000 individuals and aided preventable illnesses that would have otherwise gone untreated. Singular clinicians serve up to 5 different villages in remote areas, and act as the sole medical practitioner in the surrounding area. The sole mode of transportation on dilapidated roads between communities is motorcycles. We will be raising funds to provide another motorcycle for the Rural Health Team to assist with that transportation and allow the volunteers to widen their range of practice.
