
September 3 Program - Equal Pay Act

Great Rotary Duck Race Update (Repost)

A refresher on the status of the Great Rotary Duck Race (Previously Posted in June editions of the (B)Log)

Earlier this year the Board of Directors of the United Rotary Clubs of Lane County announced that the 2019 Great Rotary Duck Race is suspended due to lack of leadership to run the race. Since that time the URC Board has voted to distribute reserve funds, which total approximately \$100,000, equally to all of the remaining recipient agencies whose mission remains child abuse prevention and treatment. The URC Board has also passed a resolution to dissolve the 501(c)3 entity effective 6/30/2019 unless a quorum of the area Rotary clubs comprising the United Rotary Clubs of Lane County name replacement URC Board members by that date.

An area club visioning process has been discussed to determine a project or cause for a collaborative Rotary effort, which could include the return of the Great Rotary Duck Race. If you are interested in exploring and championing an area collaborative effort and feel it is important to preserve the United Rotary Clubs of Lane


