### **Upcoming Hotel Construction**

A message from the Convention Center:

As we gear up to become Graduate Eugene, the hotel will be undergoing many changes that I would like to make you fully aware of so that there are no surprises.

As of February 25<sup>th</sup> the hotel lobby will start the process to get its face lift, walls will be going up and things will be moving. The lobby bar will move into the conference center lobby on the other side of its current location. The front desk will move from its current location to the north wall of the conference center lobby on the east end. The process is going to be very fast, the remodel will take 12 weeks and will be complete just prior to graduation.



The ground floor meeting space, with the exception of the lobby space taken up by the temporary front desk and bar relocation, will not be affected by the construction.

During the construction, the entrance to the hotel will also be temporarily relocated to the 7<sup>th</sup> street entrance.

The Children with Special Needs Committee of Eugene Rotary is currently accepting proposals for grants. Grants may range in amount \$1,000-\$3,000. Proposals must be submitted by April 12, 2019. The grants will be distributed to successful applicants by June 04, 2019.

**Mission:** To provide funding to organizations that have programs or activities designed to enrich the lives of children with special needs.

#### **Proposal Requirements:**

- 1. Description of the organization and its clientele;
- 2. Statement of Need:
- **3A.** Goals/Objectives for the program or project;
- 3B. How will effectiveness or results be measured?
- 4. Brief financial statement or budget showing sources of funds and expenditures;
- 5. Brochures or other printed materials on the program, project, or organization;
- **6.** Letter of support from a Eugene Rotary member.
- 7. IRS 501 C (3) Organization Determination Letter.

#### Important Information:

A. If an organization was funded through the Duck Raffle last November, it is ineligible for funding through the Children with Special Needs Committee for this year.

B. If you are a recipient, you must report back to the Committee with information on how grant funds were spent and the effectiveness/results of the program or project funded. This report is due before the end of the calendar year.

Singular clinicians serve up to 5 different villages in remote areas, and act as the sole medical practitioner in the surrounding area. We will be raising funds to provide another motorcycle for the Rural Health Team to assist with that transportation and allow the volunteers to widen their range of practice.
