Topic: Making Music in Difficult Times

Last Week's Speaker: Dr. Bret Champion, Medford SD Superintendent

Summary of last week's topic: Back to school -- almost! Insights into the "new year" at Medford's schools

Dr. Bret Champion became Medford SD Superintendent in 2019, coming from supervising a school district in the Austin, TX area. He so proud to have been part of the Medford School District so creation of its shared vision, that ALL are learning and learning is for ALL.

As part of the summer 2021 update, he shared the Coherency Map for the school district highlighting that students are at the center of their work. His primary goals are getting the kids across the stage at graduation and assuring that in 5 years every third grade student will be reading at grade level.

With state summer school money the goal has been to provide a summer experience rather than summer school; meaning the time will be spent by the students hands on, minds on and workshop free

He celebrates the girls basketball team who after having state championship games canceled last year, went undefeated this year and won the state championship.

More medical workers, more welders, more people in building trades are needed and Medford SD has programs to train for all three. Upon graduation students can go straight to welding jobs or graduate with Certified Nursing Aid certificates.

Regarding the 2021-22 Guidance about Face Coverings - He refuses to make the school year about this. The SD will follow the state mandates as they are given and move on not letting COVID-19 distract from the real work - teaching students. A Medford Online Academy has been created so that if parents don to send kids with masks, they can go to Medford Online academy, K-12 completely taught by teachers.
