

Today's Presentation

Today we learned about the Blue Oak School, its mission and vision, and the programming that it provides to students in Napa. Pictured to the right is Dan Schwarz, the Head of the Blue Oak School and former Napa Sunrise Rotarian. Dan came to Napa four years ago from Chicago and has been in education administration for many years.

Dr. Sonia Ha, a local pediatrician, and Board Member of Blue Oak, gave a brief history of the school, which started in 2002 and currently serves 170 students in the K-8 grade levels. The school's approach to learning is unique in that the school does teach memorization or only "book" knowledge, the school strives to teach the students to learn how to learn.

We heard from Blue Oak alum, Julie Figueroa, whose sister was in the first graduating class. Julie noted that values that the school has instilled in her and her sister and the lessons



learned while attending Blue Oak have set her on a path to success. It was not easy but it was incredibly rewarding. We also heard from Jonathan Frias-Gonzalez, another Blue Oak

alum, who is now an accountant with Walsh Family Vineyards. He, too, spoke very highly of the experiences gained while at Blue Oak.

Blue Oak holds true to their seven core principles: (1) Children learn by "doing", (2) the curriculum is child centered and developmentally appropriate, (3) the curriculum builds from a foundation, (4) understanding, rather than memorization, is stressed, (5) the process of learning is emphasized, (6) the curriculum is integrated, and (7) inquiry is at the heart of the curriculum.
