educate people, and to reduce the suicide rates in Napa County.

The membership includes friends and family who have been affected by suicide, law enforcement, schools, public and private health organizations, and not-for-profit community-based organizations. They report that the average age for females and males who take their lives is 52 years and the age ranges of 55-64 has the highest rate of suicide in Napa County.

The primary efforts of the Council are focused on three primary functions: (1) Creation of a media campaign to create awareness of the problem, (2) engage in Universal Screening by utilizing the Columbia Suicide Severity Rating Scale, and (3) engage in Gatekeeper Training.

The media campaign has been ongoing for the past 3+ years and is a series of posters, pamphlets, and other media materials developed for mass distribution. Universal Screening is already being used by Aldea, OLE Health, NVUSD, and Napa County Mental Health Services. Finally, engaging in Gatekeeper Training so that individuals in Napa County will be able to effectively communicate about suicide and link those at risk to needed services.
