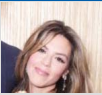

This morning we were joined via Zoom by Christi Eisenberg and Emily Paver who gave an informative presentation on The Guatemala LIteracy Project and the RISE Scholarships that are a part of the project.

The Guatemala Literacy Project is a partnership between over 600 Rotary Clubs worldwide that encompasses more than 80 Rotary Districts, 8 countries, and has been in existence for more than 20 years. The GLC was conceived and implemented to alleviate the severe illiteracy rates in the country of Guatemala. Children typically will attend school up to sixth grade and then be dropped from the system. This is especially true for girls.

The project works to raise funds, disseminate funds via scholarships, and to lessen the educational gap for the youth of Guatemala that exists between sixth grade and graduation from high school. It was reported that this gap is especially significant in the rural areas of the country and in those areas that have gripping poverty. Guatemala also is the largest source country for migration to the United States as the population attempts to escape poverty and challenges in the country.

The program has truly been a Rotary International Project that has made, and continues to make, an impact in this Central American country.
