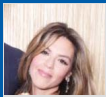

Today's Presentation

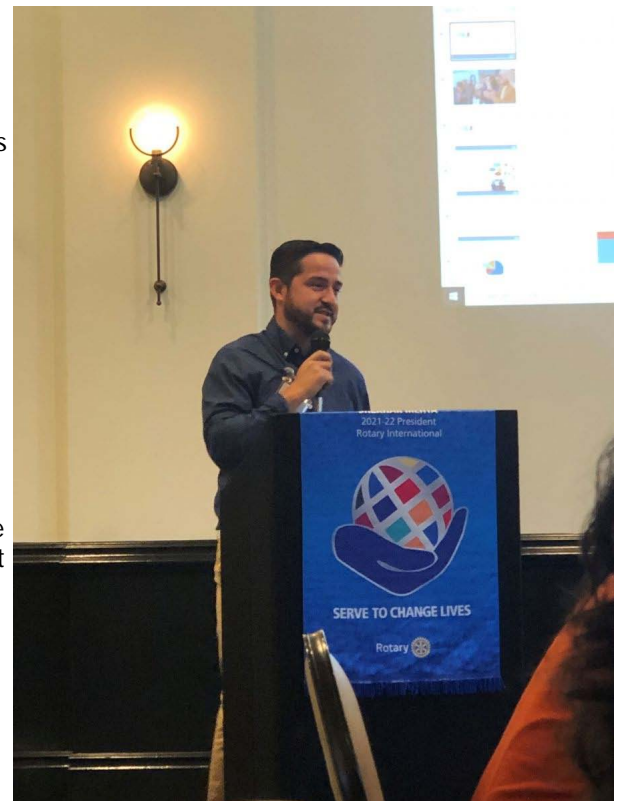
This morning we were joined by Ricky Hurtado, the Community Outreach Manager for OLE Health. Ricky is well known in the Napa community for his efforts on behalf of OLE Health as well as his community involvement.

He began his presentation by noting that the motto for OLE Health is "LIVE. LIFE. WELL."

OLE Health is Napa County's second largest healthcare provider behind only Kaiser Permanente. Over 70% of Napa County residents have received health services from OLE Health. OLE sees over 40,000 patients on an annual basis and employs 300 healthcare workers at five sites, including the South Napa Clinic that opened in July 2019.

OLE Health has vaccinated over 40,000 individuals in Napa County, currently offering a vaccination clinic at the South Napa site every Tuesday from 4:00pm - 7:00pm. Each Tuesday 250 - 300 shots are given on a walk-in basis with no ID required.

The annual budget for OLE Health is \$42 million with over 70% coming from government-related insurance such as Medicare and Medi-Cal. They offer a wide variety of services including mobile health clinics, and a Community Garden with nutritional services. The Garden
