So congratulations!! We did it:) The first Global Grant of this Club has been completed. Thank you Barry for being the catalyst for this to happen through Rotary!!

It has been quite a learning experience, especially in finding the right partners, that was one of the biggest lessons. I feel very good about who we ended up working with, however, I will say the first Rotarians and project partners I met in Nepal would not have been as thorough and detailed orientated - that's why I kept networking with community development professionals in that country and grateful o have found ICA-Nepal - who also were Rotarians. There are many Rotarians who have the right experience and expertise, often the District Governor of the area will know what local club and members have the capacity to implement a Global Grant.

If there was anything I could share as a pay it forward is the needs assessment phase - it is essential to do your homework. The Rotary Foundation's Community Assessment Form is a great tool for starting that process, see attached, it is a requirement now and I think that is a good thing to help think through all the different elements and assess if the host Rotary Club has the capacity and skillset to oversee the project. Not every idea has the people attached to implement well, and that's where our Rotary club members could lend a hand in the process is evaluating and helping train or find ways to support the host Rotary Club members in how to access the skills and resources needed to make the project happen in an organized fashion. Both Barry and I have spent countless hours talking and emailing with Rotarians in other countries helping them think through their project (beyond Nepal), it is so gratifying to see when they 'get it' and that gives the feeling like, "yes, we can make this happen!"

It would be great to have more involvement from club members in the future as well, in places like assessment, fundraising, research, program design, grant reviews, monitoring and evaluation. The Rotary Fundation has a very thought through process, that has evolved through the years and is a great format to work within, and easy to learn and grow in as well!
