
## Notes from the President:

Today's Speaker Barry Rassin

Past World President of Rotary International (RI)

Barry Rassin was the world president of RI in 2018-2019. He spearheaded a water sanitation project in Haiti, and he has received numerous philanthropic awards in his home country of the Bahamas. Today Barry spoke of the new way of communication and status of RI due to the C-19 pandemic. Barry sees Zoom Meetings as the link going forward. Since the pandemic, 75% of Rotarians have participated online and the fear is what about the other 25%? Please pick up the phone and call the other 25%, keep those who have an interest engaged. Since C-19, \$20 million have been set up for set up for Disaster Grants which would otherwise be used for World Grants. There're over 800 holding requests for World Grants. RI can use your donations if you are able to do so, as the fear is giving will soften and matching \$ may not be available in the future. Polio eradication remains RI's number one priority. Rotary looks to make Rotaract just like Rotary with the same conditions, with Rotaract members paying dues which will help assist Rotaract sustainability in the long run. Rotary is working with Toastmasters on leadership language. RI continues to address issues on environmental sustainability around the world. Barry is optimistic that we together as Rotarians will withstand continue to help.
