Today's Speaker:

Kevin Klockenga; Chief Executive Officer, St. Joseph's Health System, Northern California Region, Santa Rosa

PKM introduced Kevin Klockenga who earned his bachelor's degree at Illinois Wesleyan University and his master's degree at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis. Mr. Klockenga joined St. Joseph Health after three years as chief operating officer for the Catholic Healthcare West system at its two Mercy hospitals in Bakersfield, California. Kevin also served as assistant vice president of operations at Memorial Hermann Hospital in Houston, vice president of operations at the University of Chicago's Louis A. Weiss Memorial Hospital in Chicago, and in leadership roles at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in Baltimore. Memorial Hospital is now 70 years old. The hospital is operated by the St Joseph's/Providence Group which oversees 52 hospitals in 7 western states. Memorial Hospital has faced some challenges in the last few years with fires, COVID, union issues & strikes, doctors departing and sustained write-offs due in part to Medicare insufficiencies as well as underfunding. During the COVID pandemic, the hospital recently has dealt with 26 employees contracting the virus, and it was difficult to accurately trace the source. The hospital has taken all the necessary precautions for patients yet has seen a decline in occupancy. Now with the increasing price of Sonoma County real estate and fewer graduates of medical schools, it may make it difficult filling doctor positions in the future. Still the hospital has made great strides, with recent renovations including the newly opened Medical Arts Plaza. Memorial Hospital remains one of the largest hospitals in the north bay for trauma treatment & emergency treatment with service by Reach Helicopters. It is the only neurosurgery provider in the area.
