Foday's Speaker: Annemarie Brown: Director Communications & Grants Development





The role of community health in Santa Rosa

FRED PTUCHA introduced Annemarie Brown who is an experienced strategic communicator with strong success growing programs, teams, and community. Over the course of her career, she's worked with mission-driven organizations large and small, in the public sector and private enterprise, and specializes in growth- and change-filled environments, including almost nine years working in post-Soviet Russia. Through years working in the education and training sectors, she saw the clear necessity of early, upstream investments so more people could have an equitable chance for a successful and healthy life and so chose to navigate her career into health care. As the senior director for communications and development at Santa Rosa Community Health (SRCH), Annemarie oversees fundraising, public and private grant writing and leads patient, community, and staff communications. Santa Rosa Community Health provides integrated medical, dental and mental health care for over 42,000 low-income people in Santa Rosa. That's close to one in four Santa Rosa residents. Previously, she contributed to the growth of the Sonoma State University's School of Business and Economics, including a \$9M capital campaign for the Wine Spectator Learning Center on campus. In Moscow, Russia, she guided the Center for Business Skills Development's evolution from a 100% USAID grant-funded organization to a self-sustaining market leader with annual revenues of \$2M and a staff of 35. SRCH has been in existence for nearly 25 years and they employ 480 people. There are 8 campuses in Santa Rosa and they work in partnership with other similar services in Petaluma, Sonoma, Napa Windsor and Alexander Valley. There are systems built whereby SRCH works in conjunction with local hospitals Kaiser, St. Josephs & Sutter hospitals for major surgeries/deliveries. In 2019, SRHC facilitated over childbirth 600 deliveries. SRHC caters to the lower income, poor and homeless population with either existing or no medical insurance with 75% of the patients in an ethnic minority. SRCH was one of the first to establish a COVID test site. Most of SRCH adult clientele represent a populous that are in service industry jobs and can't work remotely. Many of the cases they treat involve diabetes and hypertension. SRCH also works in conjunction with the R.E. Food Bank and other community resources to assist patients
