Guests & Visiting Rotarians

There were no visiting Rotarians and our guest, Che Casul, was also our speaker!

Che Casul introduced himself when Fred Ptucha went unable to attend due to an emergency.

Presentation

Che Casul is a 7th generation farmer on his mother's side which now has 213 acres accommodating goats and cows and 25 acres of grape vines. He is hoping his 2-year old son will become the 8th generation. Che's passion is Ecological Restoration.

Che is operating a Center for last chance youth, primarily of high school age, called The Center for Social and Environmental Stewardship. They have several students, ages 18-25, working for them in a paid vocational program, earning \$15.00 per hour and receiving benefits. This program teaches them landscaping and ecological restoration.

The students are taken to the Center where there is a mandatory 30 minutes of Quiet Time where they can rest, reflect, read or write but without speaking to one another. They are then taught career components for such careers as construction, masonry or landscaping projects.

Their first graduate, after 11 years, returned to report on his healthy, crime free life and thanked the program for helping him.

The Center operates a summer program for high school students, unfortunately cancelled in 2020 due to Covid, which is a Green program.

A Fire Fuel Mitigation program has crews of their young people working on such projects as clearing 16 miles of road on Skaggs Springs Road and helping residents make their property safe and preventing wildfires burning their properties. In many cases the fire mitigation is through hand dug fire breaks. Their fire school is called "Fire Forward". Their funding is a fee for service-based program.

The program is going to build 18-25 low income units, with Windsor's blessing, for students while they are in the program. Che is currently working on 3 grants to allow them to provide business management classes for youth.
