• **November**: Blood drive competitions between the three Eureka area clubs. More info will be forthcoming.







### Speaker:

Jim Glover, chair of the Humboldt County Human Rights Commission, introduced our speaker Tina Taylor. Ms Taylor is herself a victim of human trafficking.

Tina Taylor is the Awareness Director of Anti-Human Trafficking at EPI

Her topic was *The state of human trafficking in and around Humboldt County.* 

She gave a great presentation on how human trafficking works, and who is vulnerable. We learned that the average age of young people being trafficked is 13-17 but can be as low as 11. Boy and girls. Often, it starts with a family member or family friend.

Red Flags that someone might be a victim of human trafficking include; kids who come to school angry and or tired; they may be carrying two phones; missing classes, have unique tattoos that the trafficker uses to mark their kids. They may attend fancy parties and wear expensive clothing or jewelry they cannot afford.
