Program:

Nancy Kay introduced Martha Shanahan who spoke to us about the Community Health Investment Program at St. Joseph and Redwood Memorial Hospitals. The program is dedicated to poor and vulnerable populations in our county.

A Health Needs Assessment is conducted every three years, with safe and affordable housing always at the top of the list. There are many in our community who are not able to manage a healthy lifestyle due to lack of funding for monthly rent. Mental illness and substance abuse add to the problem. The affiliation with Providence Hospitals has helped additional funding become available for affordable housing.

Two projects were highlighted: Onyx Apartments with 10 units and a second phase planned. Humboldt Inn will provide 42 studio units with rental subsidy from the Housing Authority (construction be begin in May 2021).
