
Zoom Meeting





Today s program was presented by former club member John Gullam from the Northern California Blood Bank. The blood bank is a non-profit that is not part of any hospital or part of the Red Cross. It is a local organization incorporated by a group of local doctors in 1951. The blood bank currently has 3 blood mobiles that work 6 days a week at various county locations. Over 10 thousand whole blood donations were collected this year at 2 thousand blood drives. Blood is given on a first priority basis to local patients, with reserves passed on to other jurisdictions for use to ensure that all donations are used prior to expiration. Donors are encouraged to donate 3-4 times a year.



President Liz closed the meeting with the ringing of the bell at 1:30.
