# A New President, a New Focus for the Club

Over 100 people attended Chris Ahoy s first meeting as Berkeley Rotary President last Wednesday. From Stuttgart to Singapore (I wonder what time it was there?), Chris s family and friends joined Berkeley Rotarians in congratulating Chris.

Chris described his own personal history from his early days as a boy from a Chinese family, born in India during the British Raj. Displaced by border disputes between China and India, Chris landed a fellowship to UC Berkeley and became a US citizen. Beginning his career in the offices of noted architect Joseph Esherick, Chris went on to achieve success as a professional facilities planner and manager in Alaska and Iowa, retiring from Iowa State University as Associate Vice President

before returning to Berkeley.

As a Berkeley Rotarian, Chris has mentored dozens of college students, including several who are the first in their families to attend college.

Using the motto Tikkun Olam, a Hebrew phrase meaning Heal the World, Chris announced that climate change would be his primary area of focus for 2020/21. He presented slides of images and data showing the severity of the global warming effects already evident and those projected in the not-so-distant future. He noted that recently supporting the environment was added as one of seven areas of focus by Rotary International.

The club has created a new Climate Action Committee (CAC), led by Ignacio Franco, who spoke briefly to describe the committee santicipated work. Throughout the year, we will educate ourselves in this issue, inviting experts to address the club. Additionally, we may support climate change initiatives financially or with our volunteer efforts, partner with other interested groups, and launch our own projects.
