# July <u>30th</u> Special Guest Speaker on the Search for Extraterrestrial Intelligence



Seth Shostak, Senior Astronomer and Director of SETI

President **Ron Leone** called the meeting to order. It's our 75th Club Anniversary year. We heard the US Space Force theme music.

**Rick Ernst** introduced guest Nick Peterson who was referred to our club by the Benicia Rotary Club. He's starting his own insurance firm here in Concord. He's interested in membership.



**Memory Woodard** introduced Kalina Campos - one of our scholarship recipients in 2018. Kalina expressed her appreciation for the scholarship and our help in finishing Nursing School at Portland. She reported on her trips abroad and her commitment to serve her Native American community in health care. **Speaker:** Dr. Seth Shostak - senior astronomer at the SETI in Mountain View. He's an expert in space and the search for extraterrestrial intelligence.

How we are looking for life in space and why we might find it soon. We're sending instruments to Mars and out into space to find signs of life. Mars was a very different planet billions of years ago. So it suggests Mars had types of life back - a biology - back then. If that can be proved then it suggest



types of life back - a biology - back then. If that can be proved then it suggests life is not some miracle. Life could just be a cosmic infection and there are a lot of planets out there.

Earth isn't likely special - but we are still looking for proof of intelligent life in space. We are looking farther afield to find intelligent life. Proximus Centauri is the nearest sun with a possible habitable planet. Fastest rocket would take 75,000 years to get there. So we use big antennas to see if we can get anything intelligent life might transmit.

There's no hiding the ball - if we found alien life everyone would know it. The government would not be able to "keep it secret." That's bonkers. So we haven't found them, yet.

A report was written and issued several weeks ago about the Navy pilots who thought they saw UFOs . The report never mentioned "aliens" and admitted they could not figure out what the objects were. There is no conspiracy to keep this secret - the government is not that capable. If aliens are visiting us they aren't doing anything we can see or trace.



Our Rotary Board Meetings will be held live at Golden State Lumber and on Zoom, the 3rd Monday of the month. Everyone is welcome.


