What is a dinosaur? How they lived? When they lived? Extinction theory (s)?



Fun facts:

The dinosaurs hip bones are a defining characteristic, as they developed directly under them so they can stand upright and carry huge amounts of weight. They are ancestors of birds. They lived from approximately 240 million years ago to about 64 million years ago. This means they were on the earth for longer than the time span between their extinction and the first signs of humans, roughly 30 million years ago.

Carbon dating is only accurate for about 50,000 years into the past and could not be used for dinosaur dating, they needed another way to date dinosaurs and developed a way to measure minerals and ash deposited, from volcanic eruptions and other happenings, where they find the dinosaurs.

The dinosaurs of North America were and are discovered in the central and north of North America not because that is where they only existed, they lived all over the planet. But Instead, it is because they were able to be preserved in the flood planes that existed when the great extintion happened.

A few members had dinosaur fossils and shared them with Dr. Marshall and he excitedly shared more information about each one, he was genuinely excited to see each one. This guy was crazy fun about dinosaurs. Did I mention that this was the best talk ever!






