New Master Developer selection

Guy Bjerke presented an informative update on the conversion of the Inland Portion of the former Concord Naval Weapons Station into a world-class project that will support a balanced approach, that is economically viable and sustainable, and emphasize quality of life. Some project numbers include: 12,000 housing units for a 29,000 population, 27,000 jobs supported, 800 acres of parks. The current master planning company recently bowed out due to an impasse with the Union Trades Bureau, so progress is awaiting a new planner. At any rate, the need to finalize permits, plans, and agreements, then finally phased out construction activity will continue for the next 30 years. More information is available at
