PROGRAM

<u>Guest Speaker-</u> George Rutherford, MD, Covid-19, "Looking Backwards, and Forward."



Dr Rutherford gave a thorough presentation about the state of things re: Covid-19 here in Contra Costa County, California, the U.S., and World. Without going into all the details (if you want you can view the recording of the meeting), here are some topics he showed slides on. Covid-19, Deaths are falling in the U.S. and California. The number of cases per day in the State and Contra Costa County. Statewide infections indicators, such as, the number of hospitalizations per day, ICU capacity, deaths per 100,000, etc. Infections by age group (most in 18-34 range); deaths by age group (most 80plus). The cases of Covid in cities in Contra Costa County-Walnut Creek are at the low end of incidence. There was discussion about Covid-19 mutations/variants in England, S. Africa, and Brazil, and their incidence in California. He gave a complex overview of the biology of the virus and its mutations and whether or not these increase the likelihood of infection and disease complications. Most of the variants seem to be occurring in S. California. He showed the seven Biden administration objectives in controlling Covid-19, which he heartily agrees with. He talked about disease control strategies i.e., isolation/quarantine, case finding, immunization, early diagnosis and treatment. Finally, he gave an overview of the types of vaccines being employed and their effectiveness.

Dr. Rutherford said that Contra Costa County is doing a "good job" in responding to the pandemic.
