The guest speaker, Bill Leary, might have been familiar to some members because he writes a column for the Rossmoor News known as "Engaging Aging". He draws upon his extensive expertise in the field of aging.

Clearly, aging is the issue of our time, since our government cannot afford the Medicare, medical, social security and other support services. There is a bubble of more retirees and fewer workers to support the systems financially.

He talked a bit about the demographics of the aging population. Bill explained that more than 50% of Rossmoor residents are single with most of them being women. Nationally, the demographic of those living alone has increased. In the fifties, 20% of the population was single and 4 million lived alone. Now, 50% of the population are single and 31 million people live alone with 13 million of this group being over the age of 65.

Loneliness is one outcome of this demographic. It's true that loneliness can also exist in marriage. One combats loneliness with friendship. Other problems and concerns with aging are:

- Becoming victims of fraud,
- Concerns about safety from physical harm,
- Increased chance of poverty,
- Difficulties with launching children result in undue financial pressures. Half of 18-24 year olds and 20% of 25-34 year olds are still living with parents.
- Fear that there will be no one to care for them as families often do not provide the support they did in previous generations.

There is a bright side though! Being alone can be a blast and more fun. We can get to know ourselves better and trust our own judgment more. Seniors are beginning to move to senior communities where they find more activities and greater opportunities for friendships.
