Rotary Prop 19

Review of Property Tax Basis Portability

- When a home of greater value is purchased,
 - the difference between:
 - the sale price of the original home and,
 - the purchase price of the replacement home
 - is added to the original assessed value to calculate the adjusted property tax base.
- Example: Home is assessed at \$250,000 and sells for \$800,000
- New Home is purchased for \$850,000
- $\$850,000 - \$800,000 = \$50,000$
- $\$250,000 + \$50,000 = \$300,000$
- Adjusted Tax Base (\$3,000 year for property taxes)

Prop 19: Chuck L. explained the many benefits of the proposed Proposition 19. It will allow statewide transfer of the Prop. 13 tax base up to three times for seniors, handicapped, and fire victims. He stated that it is well thought out, has bipartisan support, and deserves our yes vote.

PROGRAM

Dr. Juli Maxworthy spoke on the topic "Health Care Simulations: Not for Dummies". Dr. Maxworthy is a tenured Associate Professor at the University of San Francisco (USF). She is the Director of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) to Doctorate, Nurse Practitioner (DNP) Program. She teaches Quality and Patient Safety for the Executive Leader. Dr. Maxworthy is also the chair of many DNP committees and teaches Project Management and Leadership in the DNP Completion Program. She has an impressive record of educational achievements.



She showed how different kinds of simulations are used for training nurses. They can involve mannequins, standardized patients (a live person role playing), a hybrid using both, and virtual patients. These provide excellent training for both student and practitioners. Medical devices are going through trials using simulations.

In summary, medical simulations in its many forms are going to change the future of health care for the betterment of the public.
