an overview of the museum's history and current development. The Museum was built by recently deceased Ken Behring. Mr. Behring's wealth largely came from building beautiful residential communities in Florida and Danville. He was an extremely generous man who built another museum in Washington DC as well as starting the wheelchair project

for global invalids. That project provided more than a million wheelchairs worldwide.
