ANNOUNCEMENTS

District Assembly: John encouraged anyone who hadn't been to a District Assembly to go on April 6th. The training and learning about Rotary are well-worth the time. It is being held in Fairfield.

Rotary 4 Way Fest: The annual four district conference will be held at the Peppermill in Reno on May $17^{th} - 19^{th}$. The deadline to sign up for the lower price meal package (\$199) has been extended to March 15^{th} . After that date the meal

Interact Club: We are exploring the possibility of starting an Interact Club at Las Lomas High School. This is a Rotary International service club for young people ages 12 to 18. Interact clubs are sponsored by individual Rotary clubs, which provide support and guidance, but they are self-governing and self-supporting.

PROGRAM

Jim introduced the speaker, Lorna Van Ackeren, from Hillendale Home Care in Walnut Creek. As a leader in care for the elderly, she prefers aging in place over institutionalizing the elderly. The population of



prospective need is significant with ten thousand Californians turn sixtyfive each week in California. The average life span is 86 for women and 84.3 for men once they turn 65.

The various kinds of assistance are:

1) commercial Independent home care, 2) state licensed independent home care provided by three main agencies, 3) SNFs which cost from \$72,000 per year, and 4) intensive board and care where very sick people can live together in groups of four or five and are more intensively cared for. than in SNFs.

Other types of supportive care available to those who are aging in place include: 1) Meals on Wheels, 2) palliative care services provided by doctors, and 3) hospice. One can also seek help from 1) Ombudsmen, 2) Senior Center Without Walls (877 797 7299), 3) free medical counselling, and 4) Ombudsmen where volunteers can handle complaints.
