

PROGRAM

Paul Schieffer, Senior Director of Sustainability for Amy's Foods, gave a thorough presentation. Amy's is a family-owned, privately held company that manufactures three hundred healthy organic vegetarian and non-GMO convenience and frozen foods including low salt, gluten-free, and multiethnic products. "Healthy Eating" is their motto Their products have been available in most grocery stores, but now the company is starting a stand-alone business here called Amy's Drive Thru.

Amy's is concerned about the planet's health as it relates to global warming. The temperature of the planet has gone up because of the increased use of fossil fuels. This relates to the CO2 levels. Global warming is also the cause of water shortages. Amy's is concerned with healing the planet. As such, they have adopted three main strategies to run their company - 1.) People, 2.) Performance, and 3.) Planetary Health. They are focusing on environmentally responsive practices becoming 100% solar, water conservation, biodiversity, working with growers, and continually striving for less wasteful packaging. They value their employees and treat them like family. This year they have given away 300,000 free lunches to the community.
