Guest Speaker: Joy Alaidarous

"Rotary Is"

Joy is the member of our club most in tune with the workings of our Club, Rotary International, and our District 5160. She presented a full picture via Power Point of what we should know about our unique Club and its role in the community.

Rotary starts with **a Rotarian - Us.** Rotary is more than an organization. When we tell our neighbors about Rotary, we emphasize **not only** that it is the first service club of its kind in the U.S., but that Rotary is a means to developing friendships, networking with like-minded professionals and non-professionals, and doing good deeds in our community and throughout the world.

To become a Rotarian, one needs to be **invited.** Members are from all walks of life; young and old, diverse, retired, community leaders, and of high ethical standards. Rotarians live by the **four-way test:**

- Is it the truth?
- Is it fair to all concerned?
- Will it build good will and better friendships?
- Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

She spoke about District 5160 and that we are a part of the **FAB5** clubs in our area: Orinda, Moraga, Lafayette, Lamorinda Sunrise, and Rossmoor. Our District is large covering San Ramon in the south to Weed in the north. There are 73 clubs in the district and over 7000 members. She spoke about how the district works with local clubs to develop district grants that fund worthwhile endeavors. The district provides leadership through the District Governors and Assistant District Governors. Our District is part of the Western Zone of the U.S.

She also spoke about the unique relationship our Club has with the Rossmoor Rotary Club Foundation. The Foundation is the funding source for a variety of service organizations in Contra Costa County since it is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit entity. All Club members are also members of the foundation. 100 percent of all member contributions go to worthy projects approved by the Foundation and are tax deductible.

Rotary International is in Evanston, Illinois. The areas of focus are: Peace and Conflict Resolution; Fighting Disease; Supporting Education; Growing Local Economies; Saving Children; and, Supporting the Environment.

Joy also talked about **member recognition** such as; sustaining members, Paul Harris Fellows, major donors and multiple donors, and the Arch Klumpf Society. Many of our members have achieved such recognition through their contributions.

The main purpose for becoming a Rotarian, Joy emphasized, is to have fun.
