PROGRAM

Dr. Torsten Jacobsen, Rotarian from Clayton Valley, Concord, Sunrise Club spoke about his Motorcycle "Ride 4 Rotary" through India. Of the 40 Rotarians from around the world, Torsten was the only American representative.

He described how welcoming and supportive the Indian Rotarians were with their warm hospitality, great food, and luxurious accommodations, throughout their ride through the entire Country on their Enfield motorcycles. They were treated to the cultural riches of India; including music, dance, religion, colorful attire, and language.

There are 540 Rotary Clubs in a nation of 1.4 billion people. The 40 riders earned more than \$100,000 for the Rotary Foundation.

Torsten showed a video of the ride through the countryside where he said, "you never know what you're going to see coming around the corner."
