Denise Richardson and Troy Williams were guest speakers representing Open Gate an Alameda County program that offers community college courses for wards at Santa Rita Jail. The goal is to educate, motivate, lead, and inspire inmates to further their education and to be successful once they are released to the outside world. Open Gate partners with Chabot and Laney Community Colleges to offer services that aid in enrolling in college. Courses begin while a student is still at Santa Rita and once released, the student attends on-site classes. Open Gate offers full support with enrollment, financial aid applications, books, supplies, transportation, tutoring, weekly sober living groups, and other tools to ensure a successful college experience. They also assist in securing gainful employment upon graduation. The program success rate is such that only 3% of participants are reincarcerated. Success is attributed to partnering with law enforcement, working with learning disabilities, establishing relationships with other individuals who have served time and making it on the outside, and dealing with issues such as substance abuse.
