Soroptimist International of the Delta is currently celebrating 100 years of service. In case you didn't know, Soroptimist International of the Americas (SIA) was formed in 1921 in Oakland, California, at a time when women were not allowed to join service organizations. Soroptimist International of the Delta was founded June 24, 1984 and provides women and girls with access to the education and training they need to achieve economic empowerment. Why do they do this? Traditionally, women and girls face more obstacles and discrimination because of gender than men and boys. Through projects like "Live Your Dream Award", the Violet Richardson Award, Outstanding 8th Grade Stude Awards, and so many others they are able to fund scholarships and grants that help women and girls complete their education from college undergraduate studies all the way to doctorate thesis. Soroptimist International of the Delta, also supports other non-profit organizations like Rotary International and is making a positive change in our community and around the world.

The Rotary Club of Oakley has been awarded \$1,500 by Corteva Agriscience to fund a children's kite building and flying workshop in the spring. The event is part of Oakley Science Week, one of the city's signature annual events, drawing tremendous community support for animal encounters, hands-on discoveries and outdoor exploration.

The unique weeklong celebration of all things science, draws about 75 to 100 local elementary school students. We li join local agencies such as Ironhouse Sanitary District, Friends of Marsh Creek, Delta Science Center, and East Bay Regional Parks who also provide workshops. In 2022, the ever-popular Taking Flight Build a Kite workshop will be presented by our club. A planning committee will be formed in the next several weeks. 



Calling All Young Artists!
