The Speaker for November 6th: Senator Scott Wiener



Statewide Housing

Senator Scott Wiener represents San Francisco and northern San Mateo County in the California State Senate. Elected in 2016, Senator Wiener focuses extensively on housing, transportation, civil rights, criminal justice reform, clean energy, and alleviating poverty. He chairs the Senate Housing Committee. Before being elected to the Senate, Senator Wiener served as a member of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, representing the district previously represented by Harvey Milk, and chaired the San Francisco County Transportation Authority. Before being elected to office, Senator Wiener practiced law for 15 years, including nearly a decade as a Deputy City Attorney in the San Francisco City Attorney's Office. He also served in a number of community leadership roles, including co-chair of the San Francisco LGBT Community Center and on the national Board of Directors of the Human Rights Campaign. Senator Wiener has lived in San Francisco's Castro neighborhood since 1997. He received degrees from Duke University and Harvard Law School.

The Meeting Summary for October 30, 2019



Rotarians and guests were greeted by the Golf Committee.

President Karyn Sinunu-Towery called the meeting to order at 12:10 and welcomed members and guests. The traveling microphone duties were assumed by Red Badgers Mick Greco and Sarju Naran.

Up Beat News was provided by Carmen Roman who briefly shared her life story featuring her determination to succeed in education and her father who shared her desire to keep learning.

The Rotameter statistics were shared by Bonnie Bamburg and totaled 1045 hours of multiple committees.



Two new members were introduced. Daniel Jue was sponsored by Rod Diridon and Sal San Filippo was introduced by Tracy Adams. Norm Kline and Fernando

Zazuta each made contributions to the Foundation when they were unable to select the false statements in the new member biographies.



Judge Tom Hastings entertained the audience with ♦A Talk From the Bench♦ which included an expert witness testimony regarding a gun silencer. Tom read the extremely confusing technical analysis of the effect of the silencer which was presented by the expert.

Morris Chubb discussed the Dignity on Wheels Project which consists of five mobile units which has allowed over 30,000 showers and bathroom amenities for homeless people.

Our speaker Quentin Kopp was introduced by Roger Mialocq. Mr. Kopp is a retired California Supreme Court Judge who has had a unique career holding many political positions including San Francisco Board of Supervisors from 1971 to 1986. In 1986 he was elected to the California State Senate as an Independent. He discussed the problems inherent in a one party system and is working to develop a third party to contest legislative positions that will be vacant in the 2020 elections. He stated there are now twenty million registered voters in California and 8,600,000 or 43% are Democrats. Republicans are 4,710,000 or 23%. Surprisingly 29% are registered with the American Independent Party. Mr. Kopp is working with others to raise money to register voters with a new party which is to be known as the Common Sense Party.
