Fresh off the publishing of his new book "How Public Policy Became War", David Davenport, a Hoover Institution research fellow will discuss how American "*Wars*" have become an excuse by a succession of presidents for increasingly executive power overreach.

Specializing in international law and treaties, constitutional federalism, and American politics and law, Davenport is also a columnist for the Washington Examiner and delivers regular radio commentaries on the Salem Radio Network and Townhall.com (where he is a contributing editor). Past President Cindy Faulkner encouraged members to come on the ski committee's annual ski trip, which will be held the first week of February in Aspen, Colorado. She showed photos of the fun that was had on past trips.

Jon Ball, Christine Davis and Steve Borkenhagen shared the stage as they announced details about creating an iconic landmark for San Jose. Jon and Steve had recently explored the idea of re-creating the electric light tower that once stood downtown. That led them to Urban Confluence Silicon Valley, which will instead build an iconic Silicon Valley landmark at Arena Park next to the Shark Tank. **Steve** said that with so much happening in downtown San Jose, the time is ripe to create an icon that puts San Jose on the map in a new way.



The exact icon is to be determined by a worldwide competition, which closes on January 15. The three finalists will each receive a \$150,000 stipend to refine their project proposals. A design is expected to be determined in a year, and the San Jose City Council has to approve it. The icon is expected to cost millions. John mentioned figures like \$50 million and \$100 million in his speech.
