Sung Bong Choi on Koreas Got Talent

Korea's Got Talent, season 1, second place finisher, street boy Sung Bong Choi, an orphaned gum seller...

On the show during his performance he's asked, "What do you do for a living. He said, "I'm doing physical labor." He has no family, being orphaned at 3 years old. He escaped from the orphanage when he was 5, after being severely beaten. All he knew was he must eat and sleep to survive. He would squeeze in anywhere if it was dark

would squeeze in anywhere if it was dark, and would be cramped and hidden, just like

a cockroach. The places he slept in were just stairs or public toilets, and empty buildings. For ten years he lived like a Mayfly. The reason he started to sing, so many things happened to him when he was young. He was trafficked from place to place and escaped from mobs. I would sell gum on the streets, occasionally I would hear exciting music in the night clubs. Then one day I saw someone singing earnestly and I was fascinated by that. From then on, after living 20 years in the dark, I could escape from it, because there is a song. Now from the street kid to the boy singing hope... Sung Bong Choi, singing hope on the edge of despair.

He addressed the Far West Pets conference, and here is what he said:

Many of you know me as the singer who went from homeless street kid to an icon of hope. I am very honored to be invited to address the incoming Rotary Club Presidents at Far West PETS. I have a deep appreciation to those who have journeyed with me all these years and who did not give up on me, despite my shortcomings and even if, at times, I have let them down. I am thankful that many look on me as an icon of hope. I hope that by sharing with you my humble story and lessons learned you will be inspired to help the young people in your communities, particularly the marginalized, the deprived and the underprivileged. Indeed, I am honored and at the same time humbled, to be associated with Rotary whose mission is to provide service to others, promote integrity, and advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through its fellowship of business, professional, and communities. It's a huge task to continue to serve, and you my be willing to give up, I hope you will be able to see that the reward comes from when the lives of those you serve, change for the better, which is Rotary's theme for 2021-2022: Serve to Change Lives.
