

Parents by Choice. Who are we? We are a private, nonprofit organization that provides services and support to some of the most vulnerable children and families in our community. That includes: Foster Care, Adoption, Mental Health Services, Parental education, and transitional housing. Parents by Choice was licensed in 2006, with one employee. We had a small office on Kelly & Hammer Lane. We wanted to keep the main thing the main thing. Children and youth were the big deal. We soon realized that one program wasn't enough to help with all the problems faced by this population. The realities of being a parent. To raise a child you start with no experience, and you must be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You must provide food, shelter, clothing and supervision. No training provided. No salary. Parents will pay at least \$180,000 over the next 18 years. Single people can apply, but be prepared for twice the work. The truth is that being a parent is difficult work. Not everyone is up to the task. When parenting fails, children

suffer. Here are some foster care facts. May is National Foster Care Month. 1,500 children and youth in foster care in SJ County. Most because of neglect, the most obvious sign. There are approximately 250 Foster Family Agencies in California, licensed by the Department of Social Services. In 2011we wanted to help prevent children from going into Foster Care, so we initiated the Positive Parenting Program to educate parents. This program is now in 2 counties and reaches over 1,200 parents every year. In 2012 to many children, ages 18-25, were languishing in foster care, so we worked to become an adoption agency to help them find permanency. It took 5 years, we are on track to finalize 35 adoptions. In 2017 we began providing transitional housing for their next step, helping

to avoid homelessness and incarceration. We now lease 2—10 bedroom apartments in Stockton and Modesto. We now also have our Coffee shop, Plaza Perks. It teaches the foster kids how to hold a job, perform the service and become responsible young adults. We need your help. Become a foster parent, Become a volunteer—mentor,
